•General description:	<p>This master, in cooperation with the Public National Health School (Lisbon), integrates two distinct branches, optional or complementary.</p> <p>a) Training centered in History, to be taught in Évora. b) Integration in the EM master, through the statute of the "European Student". In this case, the students will have a double title recognized by two European Universities. For this, they should attend the third semester in one of the universities that, together with Evora, compose the European Consortium: Autonomous of Barcelona, Ecole des Hautes Etudes en Sciences Sociales (Paris) or Linkoping (Sweden).</p> <p>Specific conditions for the European Students:</p> <p>a) Two annual grants for the master fees. b) Application for the Erasmus for the third semester mobility c) Application for eight mobility grants for the following universities: Fundação Oswaldo Cruz (Rio de Janeiro); Universidade do Quebeque, Montreal, University of Kwazulu-Natal, Cape Town, South Africa.</p>
